- Contacting places that are looking for volunteers and have posted volunteer jobs

You can also look for a volunteer job by yourself.
Under "Job Bank" on the Frederiksberg Volunteer Portal
frivillighed.frederiksberg.dk, all posted volunteer jobs in
Frederiksberg are listed. You can access the Portal and see
which of the current volunteer jobs are of interest to you and
then contact the relevant voluntary associations or institutions.

On the Volunteer Portal you can also:

- Find handbooks and pamphlets about volunteering
- Read about pools, news and events for volunteers
- Read about other people's experiences with volunteer work

Why become a volunteer?

There may be many different reasons for starting as a volunteer.

Many volunteers will experience:

- That they develop and gain new skills or become better at something they already know
- That they feel more energetic and happier when they make a difference to other people
- That they make new friends and acquaintances in connection with the volunteer work, or that they get a larger professional network.

Good to know about volunteer work

Confidentiality

As a volunteer, you are subject to a duty of confidentiality regarding the personal and financial affairs of individuals that you may become aware of through your volunteer work.

Child protection certificate

A child protection certificate will always be collected when the volunteer work involves contact with children under the age of 15.

Insurance

You will usually be informed in an interview or in a written volunteer agreement of the insurance conditions that apply where you choose to volunteer. It is always a good idea to have personal accident and liability insurance to avoid getting into a situation where you are not covered by insurance.

Volunteer work if you are outside the labour market

If you have the desire and interest, it is certainly possible to do volunteer work when you are outside the labour market. There are different rules for where and how much you may volunteer, depending on the benefits you receive. Always inform your unemployment insurance fund (A-kasse) or case manager about your volunteer work.
